Deadlines for Responding to Offers and Deficiency Notifications

Date: May 1, 2010

Dear Claimants' Counsel:

Please note the following changes to the Revised and Restated Procedures for Reviewing and Liquidating TDP Claims (the "Procedures") of the Combustion Engineering 524(g) Asbestos PI Trust (the "Trust"). The Procedures are published on the Trust's web site at www.cetrust.org.

Effective May 1, 2010, a claimant or claimant's counsel must provide curative information within 180 days from the date of first notification of a deficiency in materials submitted in support of a claim. If no response is received within the 180 days from the first deficiency notice, the claim will be deemed deferred, pursuant to TDP Section 6.3, for a period of up to three years, after which the claim will be deemed withdrawn, pursuant to TDP Section 6.3, unless the claimant or claimant's counsel has taken curative action.

A claimant must likewise respond to an offer of settlement from the Trust by accepting, rejecting or initiating ADR Procedures within 180 days from the original offer. If no response to an offer is received within the 180 days, the claim will be deemed deferred for a period of up to three years, after which the claim will be deemed withdrawn.

As provided in TDP Section 6.3, upon deferral or withdrawal, the statute of limitations for filing a claim with the Trust is tolled for any subsequent re-submission of the claim, provided the statute of limitations had not previously run.

The Procedures for submitting executed releases to the Trust have not been modified nor have the Procedures for curing an "incomplete" claim form in order for the claim to be placed in the FIFO Processing Queue.
