NOTICE FROM THE COMBUSTION ENGINEERING 524(g) ASBESTOS PI TRUST

August 31, 2021

The Combustion Engineering 524(g) Asbestos PI Trust adopts the following policies effective August 31, 2021:

Until otherwise directed by the Trustees, the Trust temporarily waives any requirement that a document submitted to the Trust be notarized. Documents may be submitted to the Trust without notarization as provided below.

Until otherwise directed by the Trustees, the Trust temporarily waives any requirement that a document be witnessed by more than one person or by a person unrelated to the signatory. Documents may be witnessed by one person who may be a family member.

Provided the claimant's law firm has entered an electronic filer agreement with the Trust and Verus Claims Services, the Trust will accept documents signed by DocuSign or by another commercially reasonable e-signature program. Claimants' law firms should coordinate submission of documents signed by DocuSign or by another commercially reasonable e-signature program with Verus Claims Services.

In due course, the Trustees will promulgate guidelines for commercially reasonable e-signature programs and for addressing the authenticity and verifications of electronic signatures.
